Anotc, CPE ka otamirotcik weritawok kitci nta notciticik.


Today the children at the daycare are going on a picnic in the forest.

The driver looks carefully on the left and then on the right.


Ma tca takoniw otapaniw e petciparinik econi tca e ici matceparitc.

In the streets there are people walking, children riding bicycles, and children running around.




«Bravo children!» says the bus driver. «We have arrived at our destination.»

Birds are swirling around. They are busy looking for food for their chicks.



Korokonam tcipakweskew onospon:

kitikan mitcimiriw, riparamaciriw, sandwicha, wapiminaporiw, tcotcocanaporiw acitc nipiriw.

The cook takes out baskets of food: vegetables, cheese, sandwiches, juice, milk and water.


Awin ka wi mowatc rikarota? Awin ka wi mowatc rikokopa? Nin. Ote itekera sandwich ka wi mowatcik.
